- Rags and/or paper towels
- Spray bottle containing washer fluid
- Pocketknife
- Ice scraper
- Non-perishable energy bars and bottled water

Though this list may seem excessive and a waste of useable space in your trunk, all of the items will assist you in different types of emergencies. Customize your own kit based on your family's and car's needs.
